FIREWORKS AND PETS

July 4th is a time for celebration; grilling out, pool parties and firework displays. But did you know that cats and dogs have much sharper hearing than humans and often become terrified and disoriented from the loud noises?

- If you are bringing your pet to a firework display, make sure you have them properly harnessed. Many dogs are known to run away from the sounds.
- If you go out and leave your pets alone at home, protect them by keeping them in a room without windows and put on music to help drown out the noises.
- Thunder shirts, CBD oil or anti-anxiety meds from a vet often help ease your dog's fear.
- Cats often hide under beds so check there first if you think they may have escaped from the house.
- Always make sure your pet's ID tag has up to date contact information should they run away.


